The GCSE and BTEC examinations begin on Monday 11th May and run until Wednesday 24th June. For some students this can be a stressful time as the assessments get closer and closer. I was thrilled to receive some feedback from the students this week on how they could help and support each other during these next few months. Solidarity is one of our co-operative values and students discussed how they could work together to help and support each other. Their ideas included:

- Revise together to share each other's knowledge rather than alone
- Become a 'teacher' for your friend, helping them through difficult topics
- Complete past papers as a group
- Make revision cards and test each other
- Meet for a lunch time study session
- Revise with a friend/ class mate
- Help someone that doesn't understand a particular topic that you are confident with.

- Share revision notes and posters/ revision strategies with each other

The Post 16 team held interviews with Year 11 students last week and talked to them all about their plans for September. I was struck by how many students have firm career plans and mature, aspirational targets. I was encouraged by how they were making sensible choices based on subjects they are passionate about and everyone was realistic about the work they needed to do in the coming weeks to realise their goals. I am looking forward to talking to Year 11 students again in August when their Post 16 dreams can become a reality.

There is a wide range of Enrichment activities on offer in Post 16. These are an opportunity for students to spread their wings and explore new activities and disciplines, possibly outside of their chosen subjects. I would urge students to consider how they can benefit from the leadership pathway available at Post 16, maybe within the house system or the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. Students can develop crucial life skills that will help them in the competitive world of work and enable them to become valued members of the community.

Last year, 104 students secured University places, with the majority gaining their first choices whilst many of our vocational students went on to employment or apprenticeships. I look forward to welcoming the next cohort of Post 16 students in September and to seeing them flourish.
